



Youth Self Harm ER Visits in Platte County


Self Harm and Self-Inflected visits to the ER, Platte County residents 19 years old and under (ESSENCE)





Youth Self Harm Attempt Rates in Platte County & MO








Youth Self Harm ER Visits in Platte County by Gender



Youth Suicide Attempts in Platte County



"988" Crisis Hotline Calls by Week Platte, Clay, and Ray Counties, 2023-24







Youth Drug Overdose in Platte County


All Drug Overdose visits to the ER, Platte County residents 10-19 years old (ESSENCE)

Interventions Funded Include:


- ► Counseling and therapy

- ► Respite care and temporary shelter/housing
- ► Home and community-based intervention
- ► Outpatient psychiatric treatment
- ▶ Outpatient substance use treatment
- ► Services for teen parents
- ► School-Based Services



Clay, Platte, Ray Mental Health Board of Trustees

- The Clay, Platte, Ray Levy
 - ► Property tax
 - ► All ages
 - ► Includes drug courts and substance abuse treatment
 - ► Across 3 counties
- ► The Children's Service Fund
 - ► Sales tax
 - ▶ Designated for Youth ages 0-19
 - ► Cannot fund in-patient treatment
 - ► County-specific

 - ▶ Owala Water bottles

➤ Community members who develop, implement, and evaluate youth prevention programs to increase youth resiliency and reduce substance use

► Platte County Prevention Coalition (PCPC)

► A coalition of individuals and agencies who are deeply concerned about the health and safety of all youth within the Platte County R-3 area
