

Running Horse Route



Construction Priority: First/Third

This 7.57 mile hard surface route for shared use will run adjacent to Running Horse Road and has several stream and creek crossings in open and wooded areas. Beginning at the intersection of N and D Highways, this trail goes north up Running Horse Road where it leaves residential and commercial development and users find corn, tobacco, native grasses and pasture land with species of sycamore, oak, maple, hackberry, walnut and wildlife.

This trail will offer a convenient recreational experience for those in the area. As the trail turns south and follows Prairie Creek, the atmosphere is fairly quiet with open space in the background, although I-29 and I-435 are nearby. Large trees may be found close to the trail's terminus where connections to Farley, Tiffany Springs Park and Weston Bend State Park are possible.
